ONGD-Rafiki Africa was created in 2009. It focuses its activities in two areas of Uganda, Katwe-Kenziga and Ikoba, two rural areas where subsistence agriculture is the main livelihood.

Rafiki Africa's deployment in Uganda is mostly based upon the knowledge of the areas, its needs and idiosyncrasies, developed by its founder, Father Juan Berchman, who spent four long years himself as a refugee, like many hundreds of citizens who live there now.

Rafiki Africa was created by a former rwandan refugee, who, after four years living in the area, became fully aware of the needs of its population. This provided the grounds for a locally owned and culturally accepted joint action with local authorities and society to improve people's livelihoods. The idea is to create"islands of prosperity", which could be replicated elsewhere.


FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES

- Concentration of actions in medium size population centers.
- ▶ Concentration of actions on groups whose size allows to ensure their **integral development** and cover the full range of their needs.
- Sustainable projects whose ownership and management can be fully transfered to their final beneficiaries.



FOCUS AREAS

- **1. WATER:** Construction of wells and pipelines to supply drinking water.
- **2. EDUCATION:** Construction and maintenance of schools (primary and secondary) to provide access to education; boarding schools for children in need or living far from the school
- **3. ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT:** Stimulation of the area's economic development through microloans and grants. Provision of vocational training (sewing, mechanics, just to cite two examples); creation of an Agricultural Training Center.
- **4. HEALTH:** Improving sanitary and nutritional conditions of children and population in general, afflicted by endemic diseases, like tiphus, malaria and AIDS, as well as serious nutritional deficiencies.





AREAS COVERED

The first we singled out was Katwe-Kenziga. Activities here cover the four aforementioned focus areas, namely water, education, economic development and health, with a comprehensive management focus in what we can call RAFIKI KATWE proyect, steadely moving forward and consolidating.

1.- Sembabule District. KATWE project RAFIKI

- ▶ **Location:** central Uganda (48 km from Masaka and 166 km from the capital, Kampala).
- ▶ **Zone of the action: Katwe**, an administrative town with 7,000 inhabitants and **Kenziga**, a nearby village of 3,000 inhabitants.
- ▶ **Situation:** Poor infrastructure and services. Unpracticable roads during rainy season, no drinking water and no electricity.

2.- Hoima District. RAFIKI project IKOBA

- ▶ **Location:** western Uganda (40 km from Kampala).
- ► **Zone of the action: Ikoba** , small town of 3,000 inhabitants in scattered nuclei of houses.
- ▶ **Situation:** Lack of schools, electricity and potable water. Existence of a Hospital and touristic services (to visit Lake Albert).







Water is life

Water supply is a prioritary objective of the project throughout the building of wells, pipelines, reservoirs and health educacion and prevention.


Water is key to a decent life. Rafiki Africa is committed to provide a sustainable and continuous **access to drinking** water to the entire local population (also throughout the dry season, thanks to water tanks storage facilities).

IDENTIFIED NEEDS

- ▶ Most of the rural population collects water for all uses from ponds.
- ► Children are responsible for the water, often carrying it for long journeys.
- ▶ Floods are frequent during the rainy season, putting people at risk during their daily movements and increasing health risks caused by the presence of still waters.
- ▶ There are water shortages during dry season.

RESPONSE ACTIONS

- ► RAFIKI KATWE:
 - **Drilling of a 100m well**; signature of a cooperation agreement with the government for the building of a storage facility and a water pipe to the city center.
 - · Water storage for the school
 - \cdot 5 storage facilities for rainwater (three of 10,000 liters and two of 60,000 liters).
- ▶ **RAFIKI IKOBA:** Drilling of a well and a hand pump close to the city center.



New acquisition of land with a large pond to create its own reservoir for the extraction, treatment and supply of water for the school and its nearby population.

SHORT TERM FORESEEN ACTIONS

RAFIKI KATWE:

- ▶ **Building of a basin** for non-potable water for the school and nearby population.
- ▶ **Drilling of a Well** for drinking water for the school and nearby local population.
- ▶ Building of a water purification and filtration station.

MEDIUM AND LONG TERM FORESEEN ACTIONS

RAFIKI KATWE:

- ▶ Building up a basic water network
- ▶ Create a water management committee with the municipality, to ensure proper management of the facilities.
- ► To find an agreement with the municipality on water collection fees for users.

Water quality control is carried out daily, thanks to a well trained team.



















Health and Hygiene

Our commitment is to **reduce disease** transmitted by unsafe water and ensure access to drinkable water consumption, while supporting health and safety workers to improve hygiene.







The children Our priority

350 children in school. Your help is needed.

RESPONSE ACTIONS

RAFIKI IKOBA: Land purchase. School project.

RAFIKI KATWE: Rafiki-Carmen Pérez González School is already a reality. The school activities started in 2019. The school now possesses:

- ► Two buildings with classrooms for primary classes, with a temporary kitchen and canteen
- ▶ The **development of the outdoor area** into recreational and sports facilities, along with building of latrines and sanitation.
- ▶ Drinking water **supply**.
- ▶ Installation of **solar panels**, that provide 2 KW / Hour.
- ▶ Desks, uniforms, blackboards, books in English were **donated** for the furniture of classrooms.

A significant economic effort has been made, supported by collaborating companies and entities, partners, volunteers and all kinds of people committed to solidarity. **Everyone's help has been essential.** The School Board and the local Parents Association help us with enthusiasm in the impulse to have a great school.












Invest in order to improve their education quality

The objective has been met: to increase the number of teachers and classrooms in order to reduce the children/classroom ratio.





Education is the key

A future for the children involving real opportunities begins with a qualitative and continuous education.

The long term funding agreement reached with Lope de Vega School in Benidorm will be used to to finance the teachers 'salaries. This resource allows longterm planning and focus on educational priorities, but further support is necessary to ensure quality teaching, up to European Standards.

SHORT TERM ACTIONS

- ▶ Creation of a **boarding school-orphanage for 60 girls** (15% of which are orphans) with showers, dormitory, library room and shelter for caregivers. This is a great opportunity for these girls.
- ▶ A **football field** of standard size so that the school can compete with other children.
- ▶ A **new kitchen and covered canteen** which can be used during rainy season, for recreation, fitness and collective actions.

MEDIUM-TERM ACTIONS

- ▶ Construction of a **High school with 6 classrooms**, so that the best pupils can continue their studies, scheduled for the 2021–2022 school year.
- ▶ The construction of **the boarding school for boys**, identical to that of the girls.











WITH YOUR HELP WE IMPROVE

Continuous improvement of teaching in the **Rafiki Colegio Carmen Pérez González** It has allowed the course opens 2020 with an **optimized student/classroom ratio.**

From an initial number of 50 students per class, it has been lowered to 30, thanks to the re-organization and expansion of 5 new classrooms.

The course starts with 13 teachers and an academic director, 4 more than the previous year and a total of 350 children enrolled.

The students have shown a great work potential, performance and efforts, which is why it is important to raise their training to higher levels.





Support to feeding

We provide breakfast and lunch for 350 children every day.

When the school started, we initially expected that children would bring their food, as it was done in other schools. We noticed however that the vast majority of them arrived with nothing, with the associated nutritional deficiencies.

We hence took the decision to build a kitchen, to grow crops and raise poultry. Now we have **a team of three chefs and a helper** which in charge of the daily menu, based on cornmeal, beans and eggs.

CONTINUING TO IMPROVE NUTRITION

- ▶ Construction of the new kitchen and canteen. The kitchen will be larger and safer, provided with warehouses for food supplies in large quantities (to make the price cheaper). The roofed canteen will have other uses, like gymnastics and recreation.
- ▶ Continue **improving food availability** and increase the number of **students**.
- ▶ Creation of a farm school : provision of eggs. Teaching of family-owner henhouses management.











School garden

We teach them to grow more and better crops

- ▶ The School Garden will be 20,000 sqm and will be managed by the Local Women Cooperative under the guidance of our agricultural experts. Part of the harvest will be used for their own families and part of it will be used for the provision of our school's canteen. We also play to grow avocados, mangoes, cabbages and beans.
- ▶ This school garden is part of the **Agricultural Training Center**, aiming to provide information on the new agricultural techniques, seeding, watering systems, fertilizers etc. The center will coordinate agricultural activities, the experimental garden and the training of young pupils through vocational and educational training.



Training and support

Training for poultry raising and orchards will be specifically addressed to women.

The central role of women and their inherent weaker position are duly taken into account all of our projects. Women are very receptive and pro-active, as shown by the fact that 70% of participants to english or alphabetisation courses are women.

SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES AND WOMEN ENTREPRENEURSHIP

- **1. At family level.** Microcredits for purchase of goats, poultry, sewing machines and / or maintain a small family crop. All this support is being provided to ensure self-sufficiency.
- **2. At business level.** Support is provided primarily through microcredits at low interest rates to women's groups, such as the Women's Association.

Support to women's cooperatives for work and agricultural development of the town.

Sewing workshop

Pupils are provided with all the necessary to aquire new skills, which will in turn provide them with income generation opportunities through the sale of garments.

The sewing workshop provides qualified teaching, all materials and electrical sewing machines for 12 students.

For this activities, we have a commitment for long term funding from one of our donors, who also provides sewing patterns and efforts to open market opportunities in Europe.





Adult education is important

More than 300 people have joined the Adult Education Plan that takes place in classrooms after children finish their classes

► WRITING AND ENGLISH TEACHING

- The first request from the population regards teaching of **English**. We started with 150 students.
- **Literacy** is clearly imperative and urgently needed.

▶ VOCATIONAL AND EDUCATIONAL TRAINING

- Technical expert volunteers took care of the installation of illumination in the sewing workshop.

MEDIUM-TERM ACTIONS

It is essential to strengthen the educational and vocational education, focusing on agriculture and construction jobs addressed to children who fail in high school, as well as youth and adults.







Health is also important

With our agreement with the Bamu hospital, we contribute to an improved health care.

ACTIONS DONE

- ▶ We provided equipment and instruments to Bamu Hospital, donated by spanish hospitals.
- ▶ MMR **Vaccines** are provided to all school children.
- ▶ In turn Bamu Hospital provides free healthcare to our **350** pupils.
- ▶ Rafiki health volunteers provide periodically **higiene classes** to these groups.
- ► A nurse is present in the school to attend the children in their 1st

Promote development

The reality of the African regions can improve if the right conditions are there for the people to live with their own means and resources

STIMULATING PROGRESS

Plan measures for **RAFIKI Katwe** to improve livelihoodsof life he:

- ► **SCHOOL GARDEN** Teaching to grow more and better.
 - Planting of improved products like beans, cabbage, etc.
 - Increase productivity through new agricultural practices.
 - More profitable crops through improved agricultural techniques.
 - Seed research to put new products on the market.
 - **Planting fruit trees** for self-supply and sale (mangos and avocados).
- ► **FARM SCHOOL** Learn animal care and improve production.
- **Chicken farm** for the supply of school and selling eggs and chickens on the market.
- **Family owned** henhouses and goatstock (for food in eggs, poultry and mailrk).

▶ CLASSROOM AND SEWING WORKSHOP

- **Dressmaking classroom** to learn design, sewing patterns and sewing mechanics, building blocks
- **Dressmaking workshop** for particularly good students to design and sew clothing and products for sale. Sewing machines acquisition will be provided.

► ELECTRICAL AND MECHANICAL WORKSHOP

To learn about basic facilities and arrangements bike light and can set up small businesses.

► AGRICULTURAL TRAINING CENTER

Aimed at training professionals in farming, essential to the economy and survival of the population. It will also coordinate all agricultural activities of the Garden-School, women's cooperatives and experimental Garden.

MICROCREDITS AND OTHER AID

Funding is provided to put into practise acquired knowledge and skills. Aid is being offered and operated as motivation for the prosperity of families.

- · Purchase of goats and chickens livestock.
- · Rent land to cultivate.
- Purchase of **work tools**: Equipment, machinery and tools, sewing machines.
- **Scholarships** for children with special family circumstances.
- **Feasibility studies** to facilitate the establishment of small businesses in the logistics and transport for sale
- · Collaboration for the creation of small businesses

The goal is to give them tools for their autonomy and progress





Immediate projects

- ▶ BOARDING SCHOOL FEMALE ORPHANAGE. Under construction for 60 girls with showers, sleeping area, library, canteen and housing for caregivers. At least 15% of the girls are orphans and the best students will have the opportunity to access to the boarding school.
- ► WATER WORKS. Work continues to be done: reservoirs, wells, pipelines and water treatment, etc.
- ► FOOTBALL FIELD.
- ► KITCHEN AND CANTEEN Also it serves as haven in cases of strong rain, as well as additional space for special events.
- ▶ ORCHARD. Over 2 hectares for the empowerment of women.

MEDIUM-TERM ACTIONS

- ▶ HIGH SCHOOL. School building with 6 classrooms for the best students can continue their studies in the 2021–2022 school year.
- ▶ AGRICULTURAL TRAINING CENTER. Coordination of activities in orchards and cultivation and vocational training. The project foresees the study conducting a building of 4 classrooms and warehouse for agricultural machinery and equipment.
- ▶ **BOARDING-ORPHANAGE** Male. Once finished the girls' boarding school, will proceed with the construction of that for male students.






